CALL FOR PAPERS/ ABSTRACT

AUTHOR GUIDELINES:

The guidelines outline the formatting, structure, and ethical requirements for papers submitted to the International Conference on Green and Sustainable Development (ICGSD). Papers must be prepared in MS Word using Arial font, UK English, and follow the provided template. Competitive papers may not exceed 25 pages (6,000-7,000 words), while PhD Colloquium papers are limited to 5 pages. Authors must provide clear titles, affiliations, abstracts (max 300 words), and 3-6 lowercase keywords. Figures and tables must be high-quality, correctly captioned, and sources indicated. APA 7 style referencing with DOIs/URLs is mandatory. Ethical clearance details, if applicable, and acknowledgements may be included. A similarity index of max 20% (1% per source) is required with a summary report screenshot. Any use of Al tools must be declared.

DOWNLOAD GUIDELINES

ABSTRACT GUIDELINES:

The first step in the submission process is to submit an abstract, whether for a competitive paper or the Innovation Showcase. This initial submission will be reviewed to determine suitability for the conference before authors are invited to proceed with the full paper.

Abstracts should be (max 300 words) and clearly outline the research objectives, methodology, findings, and implications for sustainable development

SUBMISSION GUIDELINES FOR FULL PAPERS:

Contributions may be in the form of competitive **full-length papers**. Competitive papers (full-length papers) may be submitted on any focus area related to the theme of the conference and linked to at least one SDG and AU Agenda 2063.

FORMAT & LANGUAGE

- Submit in MS Word using the official template.
- Font: **Arial**, size 11 (text), size 14 (headings), size 16 (title).
- Fully justified text, line spacing 1.15.
- · Written in UK English.

LENGTH

- Competitive paper: Max 25 pages (6,000-7,000 words, incl. references).
- PhD Colloquium paper: Max 5 pages (excl. references).

TITLE & AUTHORS

- Title no longer than **two lines**, first letter of each word capitalised.
- Use an asterisk (*) to mark the corresponding author.
- No titles (e.g., Dr, Prof); include affiliations for all authors.

ABSTRACT & KEYWORDS

- Abstract: Max 300 words, one paragraph, no sub-headings.
- Keywords: 3-6, in lowercase, alphabetical order, commaseparated.

FIGURES & TABLES

- Figures: Caption below the figure.
- Tables: Caption **above** the table.
- Ensure high quality for clear reproduction.
- Always provide sources (e.g., "Authors' Own Work").

ABBREVIATIONS & ACRONYMS

 Use sparingly; define on first mention.

ETHICS & ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS

- Include ethical clearance details if applicable (approval number).
- Acknowledgements section is optional (funding, personal notes).

REFERENCES

- Use APA 7 referencing style.
- Include **DOIs** or **URLs** where available.

SIMILARITY INDEX

- Max 20% overall similarity, with max
 1% per source.
- Submit a screenshot of the summary page of the similarity report.
- Remove similarity report page after acceptance.

AI DECLARATION

- Declare any use of Al tools (e.g., ChatGPT) for language refinement, paraphrasing, formatting, etc.
- Kindly take note that no AI tool may be utilise for content creation.
- Authors remain fully responsible for content integrity.

CONTRIBUTIONS CAN SPAN DISCIPLINES

AND MAY INCLUDE:

- Full research papers
- Case studies
- Technical papers
- Literature review papers



All **full-length competitive papers** will be subjected to a double-blind peer review process.

Only full-length papers published in the conference proceedings.

If, after the double-blind peer review process and acceptance, you do not wish to publish your full paper in the conference proceedings, you must indicate this in the registration. Thereafter, only the abstract will be included in the publication.

Papers that do not comply with the format requirements of submissions will be desktop rejected and returned to the authors for re-submission.

An individual is entitled to present a maximum of two papers.

Submission should be made directly on the conference website.

EVALUATION CRITERIA:

The innovation project submitted will be evaluated based on the following criteria:

RELEVANCE TO CONFERENCE THEMES

- The innovation must align with one or more conference themes
- Clear explanation of how innovation contributes to green and sustainable development goals.

ORIGINALITY AND INNOVATIVENESS

- Demonstrates a novel approach or significant improvement over existing solutions.
- Addresses gaps or challenges in sustainability practices or technologies.

SCALABILITY AND APPLICABILITY

- Potential for scaling the innovation to different contexts, regions, or industries.
- Practical feasibility for implementation in diverse settings.

SUSTAINABILITY IMPACT

- The extent to which the innovation contributes to environmental, social, and economic sustainability.
- Includes measurable outcomes like reduced emissions, resource efficiency, or improved livelihoods.

PRESENTATION AND DOCUMENTATION

- Clarity and quality
- Well-defined objectives.
- Comprehensive methodology.
- Supporting evidence (data, case studies, or prototypes).

ALIGNMENT WITH SDGS AND NATIONAL GOALS

Explicit connection to specific






