## UPDATE: Special assessments for qualifications that phased out in December 2023 and December 2024 through subject RPL

Dear Student,

The TUT Senate has granted permission to students who did not meet the criteria for writing the June special exams to finish their phased-out qualifications by accommodating them using the Subject RPL (Recognition of Prior Learning) process. The permission will only be granted for students with up to <u>2 outstanding modules</u> (not including WIL modules) in qualifications that were phased out in 2023, and those programmes that will be phased-out in 2024. The students must have been registered for the modules between the years 2019 and 2023. Only students who failed such modules and did not cancel the modules will be considered. Students who had a break in studies or wrote exit exams in 2024 will also qualify to apply for subject RPL, if the above-mentioned conditions are met. The updated closing date for applications will be <u>26</u> July 2024 for qualifications that phased out in 2023. The implementation process will be concluded by 30 June 2025.

The application process is as follows:

- Students must apply for the **subject RPL** at their respective departments to confirm that the students qualify for the RPL assessments.
- Students will pay R770 per module for the subject RPL process and R359.00 for administration costs.
- If approved, the assessments will take place once per semester (date and time to be determined by the faculty).
